REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

To the Officers and Members of the Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum

Brothers and Sisters:

In accordance with Sections 99 and 100 of the Constitution and laws of the Order, the Committee on Finance met at the Home Office on four occasions during the past two years.

An examination and verification was made on a sample of receipts and disbursements of the Consolidated Account from January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2015.

All claims for Death Benefits, Disability Payments, Withdrawal Equities, Interest payments on money left on deposit by Members and Beneficiaries were carefully reviewed to ascertain if files were completed and the proper disbursements made with the approval of the General Counsel as required.

Active educational loan files were reviewed and examined. For follow-up procedures in the monthly billing, late payments and loans in default referred to attorneys for collection.

The books, records and accounts of the Supreme Auditor were examined and all orders issued by him were compared with the Vouchers in the Supreme Treasurer's Office. The Payroll account was checked and the balances verified. The consolidated Account was checked with the statements of the depositories and the monthly balances verified.

The examination included an audit of all transactions made by the Investment Committee for the Consolidated Account. All securities listed in the report for Morgan Stanley, Royal Trust of Canada, Citizens, Insurance Department of North Carolina and the Insurance Department of South Carolina were checked with the Annual Statement as of December 31, 2015 and found to be correct.

JUNIOR DEPARTMENT

At our Supreme Council Sessions and Mini-Vacations, we are always happy to enjoy the participation of our youngsters. Fun activities are planned at which new friendships are made.

\$500 CAREER TRAINING GRANT

With the focus on improving upon and expanding the fraternal benefits that are offered to Royal Arcanum members, the Executive Committee instituted a Career Training program in 2007. Up to four \$500 grants are presented each year to assist adult members as they seek to change positions or choose to embark on a new career and are enrolled in a certified program and/or course of study in a technical or trade school.

No applications were received in 2014, 2015, 2016.

ROYAL ARCANUM SCHOLARSHIP FUND, INC.

The Royal Arcanum Scholarship Fund, Inc. was incorporated as a charitable corporation under the Laws of Massachusetts in April 2004. It was organized exclusively for charitable, literary, scientific, religious and educational purposes under Section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code as a not-for-profit tax exempt status.

Members and friends are welcomed to make a tax deductible donation to our scholarship fund. Contributions should be made payable to: Royal Arcanum Scholarship Fund, Inc. and sent to the Home Office in Boston, MA.

EDUCATIONAL LOAN PROGRAM FOR JUNIORS

The Educational Loan Program is a significant fraternal benefit offered by the Royal Arcanum. It is continued to be monitored by the Executive Committee to insure its success.

GUARANTEED EDUCATIONAL LOANS FOR JUNIORS

Newly enrolled junior members with a \$50,000 - 20 Pay Life Plan, Single Premium Life Plan, or *Life Paid-Up at 65 Plan are eligible for an educational loan at 4% interest at amounts listed below:

Age 0-4 years	\$10,000 Loan
Age 5-9 years	\$6,000 Loan
Age 10-14 years	\$4,000 Loan

^{*}Does not apply to children 10-14 years of age.

GRADUATE COLLEGE EDUCATIONAL LOANS

These are available for up to \$4,000 at 4% interest. Requirements: \$50,000 permanent insurance and in force for six years.

All fraternal benefits are administered by the Executive Committee, which reserves the right to amend, alter or discontinue any program.

PARENT EDUCATIONAL LOAN PROGRAM

In September 2004, the Parent Educational Loan Program was introduced. The program allows a parent to purchase a permanent life insurance policy and secure an educational loan for a designated child or children. The parent's policy requires a minimum premium of \$40 per month. Two children may qualify for the educational loan for a \$70 per month parent premium; three children for a \$100 per month premium.

The parent designates the children eligible for the loan by including the names on the application. The children must also have Royal Arcanum protection of at least \$25,000 *Term to 25* or \$5,000 *permanent insurance coverage*. The loan amount is based on the child's age at the time of the parent's application. It may be as much as \$10,000.

NOTE: The maximum amount one child can receive from the Royal Arcanum loan program is \$20,000.

RESOURCES

A paid subscription by the Supreme Council offers our high school students and their parents with on-line resources to assist in researching colleges, scholarships, and career planning.

Members are encouraged to visit the Royal Arcanum's website, www.royalarcanum.com. Under 'Benefits', there is a Section on 'College & Careers' which provides links to Choices Planner and Choices Explorer. By entering the code "0090138" in the ID Site and the password, "sunshine", useful information and direction for students is available.

Our brochures explain the benefits available and the requirements for obtaining a Royal Arcanum Scholarship, Grant, or Educational Loan. Members can contact the Home Office for copies and/or additional information.

16/16/16 PROGRAM

This promotional program will begin on September 1, 2016 and continue for 16 months. Subordinate Councils that enroll \$160,000 in permanent Junior protection on the Whole Life, Twenty Pay Life, Single Premium, or Life Paid Up at 65 Plan, will earn a \$1,600 award for their council.

ROYAL ARCANUM BULLETIN

The Royal Arcanum's quarterly magazine, the Bulletin, is printed in full color and mailed directly to our member from RR Donnelley Publishers.

Each issue features the Supreme Regent's Message, Junior and Fraternal Department Updates, Supreme Secretary's Column, Director of Operations Column, product information, Grand and Subordinate Council news, activities and events, junior contests and topics of general interest to our readers. Our Editor, Patrick

Fitzgerald continues to do a superb job in preparing quality publications for the Royal Arcanum; his talents and expertise are very much appreciated.

The Bulletin is an excellent informational tool which highlights our members as fraternalists in action throughout the United States and Canada. The spring and summer editions recognize our distinguished service award members and scholarship/grant recipients, respectively.

Councils are encouraged to share their "news" on activities, community projects, member service, donations and junior programs by submitting articles and photos to the Bulletin. These provide the 'blueprints' for producing interesting and informative issues of our Society's magazine.

The Royal Arcanum requires that consent forms from parents/legal guardians be completed and forwarded to the Home Office, granting approval for use of their minor child's (age 13 or younger) name, council number, image, or voice on Royal Arcanum materials, such as in the <u>Bulletin</u>, or on the website or Facebook page.

WEBSITE AND FACEBOOK PAGE

Our website, www.royalarcanum.com and Facebook page are great vehicles to obtain the latest information within the Royal Arcanum insurance operation as well as our fraternal activities. The site contains information on our insurance products, and the ability to download forms for making changes to a policy, doing council reports, and in some cases, completing forms on-line for a quicker processing time. There are sections on the site on the Order's history, council activities, fraternal events, memorials, Supreme Council Officers and Home Office

Employees, college scholarships and grants, the Supreme Regent's visitation schedule and more.

The Facebook page is a social media outlet which was developed in Autumn 2013 to assist in the effort to increase Royal Arcanum's exposure and make more people aware of the Society. The site is mainly dedicated to listing the latest happenings and events throughout our councils as well as in the Home Office. Just type "Royal Arcanum" to stay connected with your Society.

INTERNATIONAL FRATERNAL SERVICE PROGRAM

"Charity," the greatest founding attribute of the Order is exemplified through fraternal service to our members and to the community. Charitable endeavors maintain being an integral part of council service in most jurisdictions.

Under the guidelines of this program, council donations of up to \$500 can be matched for pre-approved community welfare projects, annually.

For the period of June 2014 through June 2015, thirty-five contributions were made through this program, totaling \$15,550.00. From July 2015 through June 2016, twenty-eight contributions were given, totaling \$11,441.00. These amounts include the matching funds from the Supreme Council.

We commend the councils for continuing to build upon the foundation of promoting our fraternal benefit society in the community, locally and at-large, by sponsoring IFS projects. As a reminder, this is a matching-funds program, not a reimbursement program. A copy of the acknowledgment(s) from the charitable recipient(s) **should** be sent to the Home Office.

FRATERNAL ACTIVITIES

Members throughout the Supreme Council jurisdiction demonstrate that fraternalism is the "heart" of their councils. Projects, programs and activities provide opportunities for members and friends to volunteer together in a spirit of good will and fellowship. The mission of volunteer service in community outreach efforts and in support of charitable causes is evident on all council levels. In several grand and subordinate councils, members are becoming more engaged, sharing 'A Royal Gift' by doing good work as members of the Royal Arcanum.

In communicating "fraternal department" items of interest to the councils, officers and members, quarterly newsletters from the Fraternal Director were mailed. These provided the opportunity for members to report on their projects, exchange ideas, and offer suggestions for Supreme Council activities. Ongoing efforts for the benefit of several charitable foundations include support for the sight-impaired, pediatric hospitals, hospices, pet therapy, the military, and veterans.

In 2014 and 2015, the Supreme Council conducted the Fraternalist of the Year Program. The winners were determined based on scores made by a panel of judges who independently evaluated biographical sketches of the nominees. Grace Howell of San Jose Council #2384 in California and Evelyn Magarban of Versatility Council #2501 in New Jersey were conveyed the honors and presented with the "Fraternalist of the Year" Award in

2014 and 2015, respectively for their exemplary leadership and volunteerism to our society and to the community.

In appreciation for his untiring volunteerism in the community and in organizing charitable support on a continual basis, Carmine Campo of Claremont Council # 1655 in the Bronx, New York was presented with the Royal Arcanum's Service Outreach Award at the 102nd Supreme Council Session in August 2014.

Fraternal Director Cynthia Macon and the Fraternal Events Committee coordinated the Royal Arcanum's Family Summer Gifting Project in August 2014 to benefit Philips Academy in Charlotte, North Carolina, a 501 (c) (3) charity to help children with developmental disabilities and autism. Monetary donations and a host of school supplies were gifted to Deborah Hofland, Executive Director and representatives of the school who attended our 'Sports Theme' Dinner Party in the Queen City.

In July 2015, our project in Williamsburg was a 'Friendship Baby Shower.' Here's where Roy Al Arcanum made his debut! Since then he's been trekking many miles, worldwide, sharing cheer and good will as our Fraternal Ambassador. In Williamsburg, our volunteer efforts reached out to help newborns and infants in need through programs conducted by Catholic Charities, a 501 (c) (3) non-profit human service agency which operates throughout eastern Virginia. As a hands-on activity, volunteer members helped coordinate shower games, trivia challenge, shopping excursion, and diaper delivery, all organized as the Arcanian fraternal team for another worthy cause.

Again, with the overwhelming generosity expressed by our members, councils, and friends, the Royal Arcanum made a positive imprint to bring joy where the need was greatest. Executive Director Christopher Tan and staff members participated in our 'Salute to Patriotism' Dinner Party and expressed their thankfulness for the multitude of beautiful and useful infant and toddler gifts.

In appreciation for the tremendous support made to Catholic Charities of Eastern Virginia, the Royal Arcanum was recently honored with an inscribed brass leaf on the organization's new 'Tree of Life' wall sculpture at its main office in Virginia Beach.

At both Supreme Council events, we, as members and friends, helped support Supreme Committeeman Donald E. Ferry Jr.'s participation in the Jimmy Fund Walk for the Dana Farber Cancer Institute in Boston. For his extreme volunteerism and service in support of helping finding a cure for cancer, Donald was recognized in 2014 as "Walker of the Year."

This year at the 103rd Supreme Council Session in Orlando, Florida, our summer project will be conducted for Florida United Methodist Children's Home, another 501 (c) (3) charitable organization that was established in 1908 to provide a home for orphans. Today it serves as a diverse ministry that includes residential, therapeutic group, foster, and emergency care for children, primarily ages 6 through 17 years. Monetary donations and items from the Residential Care Program's "Wish List" (healthcare products, school supplies, twin bedding, t-shirts, socks, Cabbage Patch Dolls, etc.) will comprise our gift to bring cheer for the youngsters.

The recipients of the 2014, 2015, and 2016 summer gifting projects were selected by a committee from suggestions submitted by our members. We are thankful for everyone's support; their consideration and generosity made each project possible to enable our goal not only to be attained, but surpassed.

The "Lend a Hand - Lift a Heart" program continues to acknowledge the fraternal and charitable service and activities coordinated by the councils, encourage publicity and document the good work being done by Arcanian members in our jurisdictions. Councils in CA, NJ, NY, PA, and ONT have recently earned awards for their activity submissions.

The "Lorraine J. D'Emilio Legacy of Hope" Award was established to continue Lorraine's selfless volunteerism as a fraternalist. The program welcomes all councils to conduct a service project from September 1 through February 28 for the charity of their choice. Councils may submit only one project entry per year; the one which best exemplifies how members provided *hope* through the volunteer efforts of members and friends working as a team. The council must be the organizer-sponsor of the activity. The charity which was supported by the project receives a \$1,000 donation from the Supreme Council and an appreciation check of \$300 is awarded to the council for their use.

A 'Cradles to Crayons' Campaign generated a huge supply of winter weather gear for poor children, a family in need was gifted at Christmastime, and a generous supply of food staples for a soup kitchen was recently donated.

MANUAL FOR COUNCIL OFFICERS AND MEMBERS

The Fraternal Director, assisted by General Counsel, and Director of Operations, prepared a new 60-page Manual for the benefit of council officers and members. The book is arranged into user-friendly sections to cover key points on the society, products, programs, awards, forms, officers' duties, and more. Copies are available from the Home Office.

Together with the Voluntary Recommender's Book, Ritual Book, brochures, and website, these tools are

available for use by our members to maintain and grow their councils and to promote the Royal Arcanum.

NEW COUNCIL

The Royal Arcanum is pleased to report that the Sons of Poland Council #2016 was established in Carlstadt, New Jersey in May 2016; fraternal members of the Council have been elected to serve in office for the coming year. Fraternal activities, charitable projects, and social events are being planned in the New Jersey-New York area. The "O.K. - Our Kids" Fundraising Luncheon in September will support a children's hospital.

SUPREME COUNCIL OF THE ROYAL ARCANUM CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY

PURPOSE

The Supreme Council of the Royal Arcanum (the "Royal Arcanum") is a nonprofit, tax-exempt organization. Maintenance of its tax-exempt status is important both for its continued financial stability. Therefore, the IRS, as well as state regulatory and tax officials, view the operations as a public trust, which is subject to scrutiny by and accountable to such governmental authorities, as well as to members and the members of the public. its Consequently, there exists between Royal Arcanum and the members of its Executive Committee, officers, and management employees and the public, a fiduciary duty, which carries with it a broad and unbending duty of loyalty and fidelity. The Executive Committee HAS the responsibility of administering the affairs with honesty and prudence, and of exercising their best care, skill, and judgment for the sole benefit of the Royal Arcanum. Those persons shall exercise the utmost good faith in all transactions involved in their duties, and they shall not use their positions with or knowledge gained there from for their personal benefit. The interests of the organization must be the first priority in all decisions and actions.

This policy is intended to supplement but not replace any applicable state and federal laws governing conflict of interest applicable to nonprofit and charitable organizations and the Constitution and Laws of the Order.

PERSONS CONCERNED

This statement is directed not only to members of the Executive Committee and officers, but to all employees who can influence the actions of Royal Arcanum. This includes all persons who make purchasing decisions, all persons who might be described as "management personnel," and anyone who has proprietary information concerning the Royal Arcanum.

AREAS IN WHICH CONFLICT MAY ARISE

Conflicts of interest may arise in the relations of members of the Executive Committee, with any of the following third parties:

Persons and firms supplying goods and services to Royal Arcanum;

Persons and firms from whom Royal Arcanum leases property and equipment;

Persons and firms with whom Royal Arcanum is dealing or planning to deal in connection with the gift, purchase or sale of real estate, securities, or other property;

Persons employed by competing or affinity organizations such as agents or brokers for commercial life insurance companies or other fraternal benefit societies;

Agencies, organizations and associations which affect the operations of the Royal Arcanum;

Family members, friends, and other employees.

NATURE OF CONFLICTING INTEREST

A conflicting interest may be defined as an interest, direct or indirect, with any persons or firms mentioned.

Direct Conflicts of interest involving the Executive Committee include:

Holding office, serving on the board, participating in management, or being otherwise employed as an agent or broker with any third party dealing with life insurance such as a commercial life insurance or another fraternal benefit society;

Receiving remuneration for services with respect to individual transactions involving life insurance from a commercial life Insurance Company or another fraternal benefit society;

It has long been and remains the policy, and history, of the Royal Arcanum that individuals with direct conflicts of interest cannot be members of the Executive Committee.

Indirect Conflicts of interest include:

Owning stock, debt or any proprietary interest in a non-publicly traded life insurance company;

Using Royal Arcanum's time, personnel, equipment, supplies, or goods will for other than approved activities, programs, and purposes;

Receiving personal gifts or loans from third parties dealing or competing with the Royal Arcanum.

Receipt of any gift is disapproved except gifts of a value less than \$50, which could not be refused without discourtesy. No personal gift of money should ever be accepted.

INTERPRETATION OF THIS STATEMENT OF POLICY

The areas of conflicting interest listed and the relations in those areas which may give rise to conflict, as previously listed, are not exhaustive. Conflicts might arise in other areas or through other relationships. It is assumed that the members of the Executive Committee, officers, and management employees will recognize such areas and relation by analogy.

It is the policy of the Royal Arcanum that the existence of any of the interests described herein shall be disclosed before any transaction is consummated.

It shall be the continuing responsibility of the Executive Committee, officers, and management employees to scrutinize their transactions and outside business interests and relationships for potential conflicts and to immediately make such disclosures.

DISCLOSURE POLICY AND PROCEDURE

Transactions involving indirect conflicts or interest may be undertaken only if all of the following are observed:

The conflicting interest is fully disclosed;

The person with the conflict of interest is excluded from the discussion and approval of such transaction;

A competitive bid or comparable valuation exists; and The Executive Committee or a duly constituted committee thereof has determined that the transaction is in the best interest of the organization.

Disclosure in the organization should be made to the Supreme Regent (or if she or he is the one with the conflict, then to the Chairman of the Executive Committee), who shall bring the matter to the attention of the Executive Committee or a duly constituted committee thereof. Disclosure involving members of the Executive Committee should be made to the Chairman of the Executive Committee (or if she or he is the one with the conflict, then to the Supreme Regent who shall bring these matters to the Executive Committee or a duly constituted committee thereof.

The Executive Committee or a duly constituted committee thereof shall determine whether a conflict exists and in the case of an existing conflict, whether the contemplated transaction may be authorized as just, fair, and reasonable to the Royal Arcanum. The decision of the Executive Committee or a duly constituted committee thereof on these matters will rest in their sole discretion, and their concern must be the welfare of the Royal Arcanum and the advancement of its purpose.

The Conflict of Interest Policy was adopted by the Executive Committee. Each year the members of the Executive Committee and Director of Operations shall sign a no conflict of interest certification in the form attached hereto:

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE CONSTITUTION AND LAWS OF THE ORDER

The Executive Committee recommends the following changes to the Constitution and Laws of the Order (deleted items are shown as strikeouts; new language is shown as underlined):

Section 485

For a variety of reasons, it has been difficult to form new councils to help spread the message fraternalism. The Executive Committee believes that by reducing the number of members needed to form a new council, the Society can attract new councils. As a result the Executive Committee recommends that Section 485 of the Constitution and Laws of the Order be amended as follows:

Sec. 485. A Council shall not be instituted with more than two hundred nor less than twenty five Charter Members.

Is amended to read:

Sec. 485. A Council shall not be instituted with more than two hundred nor less than sixteen Charter Members.

And also the following changes to conform to current operations:

Sec. 2. Which now reads

The objects of the Order are:

Fraternal Union

1st. To unite fraternally all persons of good moral character, who are socially acceptable and over sixteen years of age.

Is amended to read:

The objects of the Order are:

Fraternal Union

1st. To unite fraternally all persons of good moral character, who are socially acceptable and over <u>eighteen</u> years of age.

Section 2 which now reads:

The objects of the Order are:

Juvenile Protection

6th. To provide Juvenile protection for all children and to issue Certificates from birth up to the age of sixteen years.

Is amended to read:

Juvenile Protection

6th. To provide Juvenile protection for all children and to issue Certificates from birth up to the age of <u>eighteen</u> years.

Section 150 is out of date and should be removed: The Application

Sec. 150. The application for the institution of a Grand Council must be signed by not less than ten Past Regents or Regents in good standing who represent five or more different Councils within the territory in which the Grand Council is to be instituted.

Sections 180(5) and (6) are out of date and should be removed.

- (5) A council shall be composed exclusively of men or exclusively of women, and no member of opposite sex shall be entitled to admission thereto at any time, except to assist in its organization or upon a special invitation after a vote of the Council duly held pursuant to the provisions of Section 180 (6).
- (6) Notwithstanding the provisions of Sections 180 (5), 361, 363 (1) 363(3) and 364, requiring members of a

Council to be of the same sex, a Council may accept as members persons of both sexes, provided that the Council by a two thirds vote of its members present at a meeting called as hereinafter provided vote to do so. Notice of such meeting shall be mailed at least fourteen days prior to the meeting to each member of the Council, addressed to him at his address appearing on the Secretary's book, and shall contain a notice to the effect that a vote will be taken upon the question as to whether persons of both sexes shall be admitted to membership in the Council.

Section 265 should be revised to reflect the current age for adult membership :

Qualification.

Sec. 265. Each person admitted to membership in the Royal Arcanum must be a person of good moral character, a believer in a Supreme Being, and over the age of sixteen years.

Is amended to read:

Qualification.

Sec. 265. Each person admitted to membership in the Royal Arcanum must be a person of good moral character, a believer in a Supreme Being, and over the age of <u>eighteen</u> years.

Parts of Section 269 are out of date and should be removed.

Application to Be Signed

Sec. 269. (1) Each applicant for membership in the Order must sign the application for admission to membership. Said application shall be prescribed by the Supreme Council and shall state the date of the applicant's birth, his age, occupation and residence, and the name and residence of his proposed beneficiary or beneficiaries together with sufficient information to identify such beneficiary or beneficiaries. No such application shall take effect so as to entitle the applicant to benefit membership in the Order until the same shall have been approved by the Home Office of the Order.

(2) He must be recommended by two members in good standing, one whom must be a member of the Council to which he makes application, and the recommenders

must sign the application personally.

- (3) An applicant who cannot write his name may make his mark with two witnesses thereto.
- (4) Any former member of the Order who has severed his connection by reason of taking advantage of Optional Extended Protection shall have the right to apply for membership as new member, subject to the foregoing provision and restrictions.
- (5) Any member taking a Certificate of Final Withdrawal may be readmitted only as a new member, but the payment of the Degree fee and all of the ceremony of conferring the Degree, except the obligation and instruction in the signs, words and password, may be dispensed with.

Two sections are amended to delete the reference to Life Members and add the Director of Home Office Operations:

Sec. 8. The Supreme Council shall be composed of its elective officers, the representatives from the Grand Councils, Past Supreme Regents, Life Members of the Executive Committee, and members who have served thirty years or more in the Supreme Council, provided they remain in good standing in their Subordinate Councils, and providing further that no member who is a full time paid representative of the Field, Promotion and Council Service Departments shall be eligible for membership in such Supreme Council. The representatives from the Grand Councils, or their alternates, shall be entitled to not less than two-thirds of the votes of the entire membership of the Supreme Council, and should their number become less than two-thirds, then and in such event each member of the Supreme Council not sitting as a representative or alternate shall be entitled to only a fraction of the vote as will make the aggregate vote of such members equal to one-third of the votes of the entire membership. No other member of this Order, except the General Counsel, Director of Promotion, Director of Council Service, Editor of the Official Bulletin, Director of the Junior Department and Actuary of the Order, shall under any circumstances be admitted to the Session of the Supreme Council and they shall not be entitled to a vote, unless otherwise qualified, except that the Supreme Council may, admit as spectators any members in good standing shall under any circumstances be admitted to the Session of the Supreme Council and they shall not be entitled to a vote, unless otherwise qualified, except that the Supreme Council may, admit as spectators any members in good standing in the Order, provided that they shall be seated in a part of the room where the Session is held, separate and apart, from the members of the Supreme Council.

Is amended to read:

Sec. 8. The Supreme Council shall be composed of its elective officers, the representatives from the Grand Councils, Past Supreme Regents, and members who have served thirty years or more in the Supreme Council, provided they remain in good standing in their Subordinate Councils, and providing further that no member who is a full time paid representative of the Field, Promotion and Council Service Departments shall be eligible for membership in such Supreme Council. The representatives from the Grand Councils, or their alternates, shall be entitled to not less than two-thirds of the votes of the entire membership of the Supreme Council, and should their number become less than twothirds, then and in such event each member of the Supreme Council not sitting as a representative or alternate shall be entitled to only a fraction of the vote as will make the aggregate vote of such members equal to one-third of the votes of the entire membership. No other member of this Order, except the General Counsel, Director of Promotion, Director of Council Service, Director of Home Office Operations, Editor of the Official Bulletin, Director of the Junior Department and Actuary of the Order, shall under any circumstances be admitted to

the Session of the Supreme Council and they shall not be entitled to a vote, unless otherwise qualified, except that the Supreme Council may, admit as spectators any members in good standing in the Order, provided that they shall be seated in a part of the room where the Session is held, separate and apart, from the members of the Supreme Council.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

Who Constitute

Sec. 91. (a) The Supreme Regent, Supreme Vice-Regent, Supreme Orator, Sitting Past Supreme Regent, Supreme Secretary, the Elective Members to be selected from any of the members who compose the Supreme Council and Life Members of the Executive Committee, shall constitute a standing committee to be known as the Executive Committee. Such Executive Committee shall elect from its membership a Chairman who shall appoint subcommittees and be an ex-officio member thereof and shall appoint a member of the Order to act as Recording Secretary. The Committee shall have the power to elect and fix the compensation of the Vice Chairman to perform such duties as may be assigned and to act as Chairman in the absence of the Chairman. No member who has reached his or her 75th birthday shall be eligible for election to the Executive Committee. If a member over 75 years of age is elected to office which automatically includes an membership on the Executive Committee, such member shall not be entitled to vote on matters that come before the Committee. If a member under age 75 is elected to the Executive Committee thereafter reaches 75, such member may continue on the Committee, with voice and vote, until the next election at a Supreme Council Session. The Compensation of the Chairman and said Recording Secretary may be fixed by the Executive Committee

Is amended to read:

Sec. 91. (a) The Supreme Regent, Supreme Vice-Regent, Supreme Orator, Sitting Past Supreme Regent, Supreme Secretary, the Elective Members to be selected from any of the members who compose the Supreme Council, shall constitute a standing committee to be known as the Executive Committee. Such Executive Committee shall elect from its membership a Chairman who shall appoint all subcommittees and be an ex-officio member thereof and shall appoint a member of the Order to act as Recording Secretary. The Committee shall have the power to elect and fix the compensation of the Vice Chairman to perform such duties as may be assigned and to act as Chairman in the absence of the Chairman. No member who has reached his or her 75th birthday shall be eligible for election to the Executive Committee. If a member over 75 years of age is office which automatically includes elected to an membership on the Executive Committee, such member shall not be entitled to vote on matters that come before the Committee. If a member under age 75 is elected to the Executive Committee thereafter reaches 75, such member may continue on the Committee, with voice and vote, until the next election at a Supreme Council Session. The Compensation of the Chairman and said Recording Secretary may be fixed by the Executive Committee

The following sections are amended to reflect current operations:

There is added to Section 45 the following: SUPREME SECRETARY

Other Duties

Sec. 45(a). Such other duties as may be assigned by the Executive Committee.

Section 92(7)(b) which now reads

(b) They shall have the power to appoint an Actuary for the Order and a General Counsel for the Order and to fix the compensation for such appointees. They shall also have the power to appoint a General Manager of the Home Office, whose duty it shall be to supervise the employees at and in said Home Office, and who shall also have such powers and shall perform such duties as the Executive Committee shall designate. Such appointment shall be upon such terms and compensation as shall be determined from time to time by the Executive Committee.

Is amended to read:

(b) They shall have the power to appoint an Actuary for the Order and a General Counsel for the Order and to fix the compensation for such appointees. They shall also have the power to appoint a <u>Director of Home Office Operations</u>, whose duty it shall be to supervise the employees at and in said Home Office, and who shall also have such powers and shall perform such duties as the Executive Committee shall designate. Such appointment shall be upon such terms and compensation as shall be determined from time to time by the Executive Committee.

HOME OFFICE OPERATIONS

The Proceedings of the 102nd Supreme Council Session in Charlotte, North Carolina were prepared, printed and available to send to the Massachusetts Insurance Department, Supreme Council Officers, Supreme Council Representatives, and to the Chief Agent in Canada upon request.

The Director of Operations Nick Benoit oversees the Home Office and Insurance Operations working closely with the Supreme Treasurer, General Counsel and Actuary on a day to day basis.

All Quarterly and Annual reports were sent to all states required in a timely fashion and to the NAIC, as well as electronically to AM Best.

We annually file Form 990 (Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax). We also file a 990N on behalf of each individual Grand Council. It is mandatory for all councils to have their own tax ID number on record in the Home Office.

Vision Financial Group reviewed our financial records and reported our financial statements were in-line with our established accounting practices and present an accurate statement of our financial position.

We electronically filed the "DCAT" Dynamic Capital Adequacy testing report with "OSFI" Office of Superintendent Financial Institutions in Canada that found our Order was in satisfactory condition.

STANDARD ANALYTICAL SERVICE

Standard Analytical Service, Inc. produced the annual report for 2015 showing Royal Arcanum with an asset over Liability ratio of \$113.54 of assets compared to every \$100 of Liabilities. This indicator continues to display the Financial Strength of Royal Arcanum, as the average 25 leading Life Insurance carriers had a \$106.01 ratio.

MERGER WITH THE ASSOCIATION OF THE SONS OF POLAND

In January of 2016 a merger with the Association of the Sons of Poland domiciled in Carlstadt New Jersey was completed. As a result of the merger, we added approximately 3,400 certificates to our Society and added approximately \$994,000 to our Surplus. This merger has been a benefit on many levels, as the former "ASOP" share many of the same beliefs as our members. Our vision is to continue to grow our Society by creating and building

Fraternal Activities together. The merger announcement was published in our quarterly Bulletin, on our website and social media. In addition to the assets received, the Royal Arcanum received the former "ASOP" home office building in Carlstadt New Jersey.

EMPLOYEE PENSION PLAN

The previously frozen employee pension plan effective January 1st 2011 was terminated in February of 2016. The participants were given the option of maintaining their guaranteed benefits or choosing a lump sum distribution. The elimination of this plan will reduce yearly operational expenses.

OPERATIONS/SURPLUS

In 2014 the Society experienced an operational gain of \$106,922; however after providing dividends to members we faced an operational loss of \$72,638. The Surplus was reduced by \$639,108 bringing the total to \$13,717,863.

In 2015 the Society experienced an operational gain of \$233,034 after providing dividends to members, our net gain was \$51,635. The Surplus also decreased by \$1,178,501 to \$12,539,362.

A major factor in our overall Surplus is our Canadian operation and the effects of the foreign currency exchange rate. When the Canadian dollar is strong, the risk factor is minimal; however as the Canadian dollar has been weak over the past few years, this has affected our Surplus in the negative by \$910,000 in 2015 and by \$1.8 million over the last 3 years. When the Canadian dollar increases in value so will our surplus.

DISTRIBUTION OF DIVIDENDS

During the years 2014 and 2015 \$179,560 and \$181,399 were provided to members.

Dividend payments will continue to be reviewed and evaluated on an annual basis, based upon the society's business operation.

FRATERNAL INVESTMENT BILL

In 2013 Nick Benoit submitted a request to amend a Massachusetts general law that restricts Fraternal Orders domiciled in the state of Massachusetts to invest only up to 25% of our surplus in stocks. Nick submitted a request to increase this to 50%, allowing the Investment committee the ability to increase their investment opportunities available to obtain a higher return. This bill wasn't passed in Legislation, however a new bill H869 was refiled with Legislation in 2015 in attempts to having the law amended. We have gained additional support from House Representatives and we are confident in having the bill approved this session in 2016.

MASSACHUSETTS MARKET CONDUCT EXAM

The Massachusetts Department of Insurance completed a Market Conduct Exam in May of 2016 and found Royal Arcanum in very good standing. The review found Royal Arcanum with a solid and strong outlook, which is certainly a positive review and one we expect to earn when reviewing our operation. Our Business plan that Director of Operations Nick Benoit created in 2013 was found to be extremely accurate in many phases regarding production levels as well as business endeavors, such as merging with fraternal societies when an opportunity is presented. The only material issue

discovered was our Investments being above the 25% allotment, as previously mentioned in our Investment Bill currently in Legislation.

DISASTER RECOVERY PLAN

The Disaster Recovery plan has been maintained and updated to ensure compliance in all states that we are licensed and periodically updated to ensure our plan is current to today's environment.

Nick Benoit substantially upgraded our Anti-Fraud plan to ensure compliance with each state Department of Insurance that we are licensed. This extensive plan includes an involved approach to preventing fraud and an annual training for the home office staff.

SALES OPERATION

Our operation has focused on bringing in high quality business that stays active for the membership standpoint as well as the financial standpoint. After an overhaul in our Sales philosophy in 2013, we increased our persistency dramatically in 2013 and this 81% first year level has been sustained since then. We have seen an increase in overall persistency when reviewing longer time periods such as 2 years +. Our sales have also increased our renewal premium on an annual basis, which helps lead to increased revenue for the Society and a major asset toward profitability since commissions are minimal after the first year. There is a continued focus put on recruiting new agents/distribution channels and terminating agents with less than impressive persistency rates and showing no sign of improvement after measures were taken to address the persistency issues.

Since we terminated our Pre Need Insurance agreement with Catholic Holy Family Society in February 2013, we have seen our Pre Need Insurance production increase dramatically. In 2012 our Pre Need division produced \$1.12 million in premium and while this was solid we produced over \$4 million in premium in 2015. We continue to monitor this business line to ensure the business we are producing is in line with our overall product portfolio mix.

The Annuity rate for our fixed product has been maintained for the past 2 years. Our product offers a competitive 3.5% first year rate for members and 3% first year rate for non-members. After the first year the product is guaranteed not to go below 2%. This rate remains to be consistent in this low interest rate environment.

INSURANCE PRODUCTS

Royal Arcanum currently has many Life Insurance Products in our Portfolio, which is listed below as well as a Guaranteed Fixed Annuity. We are also reviewing potential Insurance Products to add to our Portfolio. The focus has been on Simplified Issue/Final Expense type policies with reduced underwriting, however an initiative has been developed to market toward the younger audience. We reduced the minimum issue age of our Final Expense product and renamed it "Simplified Issue". This started to pay dividends and we have issued some policies to the younger age groups. Another goal we have is to further establish our junior policies by marketing our College scholarships and benefits that set us apart from many Societies and Commercial Carriers. This will be an ongoing effort as we continue to develop additional products to benefit the Society.

We are in the process of becoming licensed in additional states to further expand our production.

MEMBER BENEFITS

In 2015 a new member benefit, **Perk Spot** was introduced to members via the quarterly Bulletin as well as through our Web Site and Social Media. This benefit provides members with savings on monthly cell phone plans, hotel, and car rentals, and for products offered through many vendors.

HOME OFFICE BUILDING

Our Home Office Building is at 61 Batterymarch Street Boston, Massachusetts and is managed by CB Richard Ellis. The Royal Arcanum Operation utilizes 2 of the 6 floors in the building, while we lease out the remaining 4 floors to tenants. Litigation Document Services occupies the 4th floor and signed a lease in November of 2015 extending the lease from the previously expiry date of April 30th 2016 to April 30th 2021. Litigation Document Services has been leasing out space in the building for over 20 years. Mercury Business Services occupies the first and second floors and we have extended their lease to April 30th 2021. The fifth floor has been leased out to the Lawyers' Committee for Civil Rights and Economic Justice, Inc. with the lease expiring on August 31st 2026.

Effective February 1st, 2014 a new vendor - Precision Elevator was contracted to replace Eagle Elevator as the building's elevator contractor, as their contract expired. This move reduces our Annual Maintenance Service Fee by about \$1,000 as well as reduces the call back service visits by \$20 an hour. The reason for the move was partly financial and poor service since Eagle Elevator was visiting the building routinely to fix the same issue multiple times in the same week. We have had no issues since switching providers.

MILEAGE ALLOWANCE

All Officers and Representatives traveling by air, train or other means of travel to the 103rd Supreme Council Session, will be reimbursed actual travel expenses for the most economical and reasonable method of transportation; receipts **must** be attached to the Form No.47.

Officers and representatives traveling by automobile will be reimbursed at the rate of .565 cents per mile, for

their actual mileage to the Session, up to a maximum of 500 miles, and 500 maximum return miles. If one car/van is utilized to transport multiple Officers and/or Representatives, only ONE member will be entitled for mileage/tolls/parking reimbursement from the Supreme Council. Toll receipts or EZ Pass statements should be attached to the Form No. 47

A meal allowance will be given to all Officers and Representatives.

IMPORTANT HIGHLIGHTS

The Royal Arcanum once again was honored at the American Fraternal Alliance with awards as National Fraternalist of the Year to Royal Arcanum members. In September 2014, Sister Grace Howell of San Jose Council in California was acclaimed at their meeting in Austin, Texas. The following year, in September 2015, Sister Evelyn Magarban of Versatility Council in New Jersey was named their National Fraternalist of the Year. Royal Arcanum members continue to support our Summer Gifting projects with impressive consistency. Last session's project with the Philips Academy added over \$8,500 along with goods and supplies to the Charlotte school for those with autism and developmental disabilities. Brothers and Sisters:

In accordance with Sections 99 and 100 of the Constitution and laws of the Order, the Committee on

Finance met at the Home Office on four occasions during the past two years.

An examination and verification was made on a sample of receipts and disbursements of the Consolidated Account from January 1, 2014 to December 31, 2015.

All claims for Death Benefits, Disability Payments, Withdrawal Equities, Interest payments on money left on deposit by Members and Beneficiaries were carefully reviewed to ascertain if files were completed and the proper disbursements made with the approval of the General Counsel as required.

Active educational loan files were reviewed and examined. For follow-up procedures in the monthly billing, late payments and loans in default referred to attorneys for collection.

The books, records and accounts of the Supreme Auditor were examined and all orders issued by him were compared with the Vouchers in the Supreme Treasurer's Office. The Payroll account was checked and the balances verified. The consolidated Account was checked with the statements of the depositories and the monthly balances verified.

The examination included an audit of all transactions made by the Investment Committee for the Consolidated Account. All securities listed in the report for Morgan Stanley, Royal Trust of Canada, Citizens, Insurance Department of North Carolina and the Insurance Department of South Carolina were checked with the Annual Statement as of December 31, 2015 and found to be correct.





SUPREME COUNCIL OF THE ROYAL ARCANUM

IN MEMORIAM

JOSEPH J. RADECKI, SR. 1920 - 2015

Joe was born in Canton to our Busi (a Polish immigrant) and Dziadzi. Neither of his parents spoke English until their children went to school. As a little "aside" when I used took dad to the VA hospital I always pretended that I didn't know the way - he was always so happy to give me the full East Baltimore tour. We would ride by the house where he was born and every time without fail he would say -you know a great thing happened there on December 10, 1920 - on that day I was born in this house... Indeed it was a great thing- Our good Lord was kind enough to place Joseph Radecki on this earth and actually loaned him to us for 94 Blessed years. Dad went to St Casimir's school then to Polytechnic High school. In April of 1942 he received his Certificate of Engineering from Johns Hopkins. Like many other Patriotic young men of that time on August 1 1942 dad joined the US Navy where he served as a flight engineer until 1946. I'm not exactly sure when he started his career at Bethlehem steel but worked there for about 40 years as a supervisor in the power plant.

After returning home from the Navy, one of his buddies fixed him up with a beautiful and very young Agnes Bogdan. You see dad was 26 and mom only 17 – thus he earned the nickname "cradle snatcher". They married on April 1948 and I guess that my Grandmother was all wrong about the "cradle snatcher" – dad and mom were a match made in heaven and even with the trials and tribulations of having 6 kids 20 years apart – there marriage remained strong and Blessed. After our youngest sister moved out of the house dad called me to tell me he

was changing all the locks on the house but of course he was just kidding.

Dad was a founding member of Our Lady Of Fatima Church supporting it many ways. Dad and mom had either a child or grandchild in OLF for 29 consecutive years. That must have been some sort of record. Many a Friday evening he was the "donut" fryer at popular "Friday night Bingo". He was a member of the Santa Maria Council of the Knights of Columbus and remained a loyal member of the Jolly Club and appreciated all of his many friendships.

Dad was very involved in a Fraternal Organization known as the Royal Arcanum which he joined in March 1942. He held various offices in the organization. He became a Life Member of the Supreme Council in 2004. (This means he served on the Supreme Council for 30 years). He was also a Royal Arcanum Legion of Honor Award member. During this time, he also was involved with the Fraternal Congress of Maryland for which held several offices until serving on the Board as President and then Past President.

He loved the Orioles, the Colts and eventually he even accepted the Ravens as his home team (though he would call them "bums" if they weren't winning.) He loved tradition – especially his Polish heritage. In earlier years he became quiet proficient in making homemade Polish Sausage, Raisin bread and perogee. He loves when his children and grandchildren carry on the traditional Polish customs at weddings, Easter and Christmas.

As his children we were fortunate to have a father that instilled both faith and values. His church and God were very much a part of his life. He worked hard to give his children a Catholic education and taught us by example many of life's lessons. He was equally proud of his country

- every day raising a flag on the pole that still stands in their yard.

He could fix anything. He earned the nickname by a family member as MacGyver – never called in a repair man. I remember coming home from school one day and the entire washing machine was all over the basement floor. The next day it was back together washing clothes just like it was brand new – Dad never threw anything out that could be fixed.

He taught us by his example the value of hard work. He used to say that if you work hard enough you can do anything you want, don't depend on other people to give you anything – work for it and if you can't do it right then don't do it all.

I could go on and on about one of God's most perfect creations – but I think that you have the picture. Dad we love you, we will miss you terribly and you will always be in our hearts. With 14 grandchildren and 21 (plus 2 on the way) great grandchildren - your legacy will always live on.

I am sure that dad is looking down from heaven and saying don't weep for me – but honor me by living well the life that God has created for you.

Thank you all for joining us to celebrate the legacy of our dad's life.

May she rest in heavenly peace.




MAURICE LARIVIERE 1929 - 2014
