

#### INTEGRITY COUNCIL CONTINUES TO HELP THE HOMELESS

Lillie Mae Panichelli and Rev. The Center at the Church provides opportunities for eighteen persons in the homeless community to come by, shower, launder their clothing, and have a cup of tea each weekday. They must make a reservation and not just drop in!

Of course, clean clothing is always needed! Integrity Council, a longtime supporter of Arch Street Church's work with the homeless, has provided and served meals at the Church's "Grace Café" and has made substantial contributions to help their homeless neighbors.

The Salvation Army is actively serving in 133 countries to offer hope to those in need. Its social service programs provide food, shelter and clothing to the homeless and poor. The organization also offers services for youth, seniors, veterans, and the imprisoned.

Many useful items were donated for the council project and the fraternalists anticipate continuing its charitable support with additional contributions in time for summer.

#### **HELPING HANDS FOR UKRAINE: UPDATE**

The Supreme Council gratefully acknowledges all of the councils, members, and friends for their generous response to supporting our Society's efforts for the

Ukrainian people as their homeland remains impacted by war. During the past twelve months, the Royal Arcanum provided over \$45,000 to help the Ukrainian people – those who fled to Poland and to neighboring countries and those who stayed in Ukraine, facing an uncertain future.

As an extended family, the Royal Arcanum continues to offer funds, all-new clothing, bedding and other goods, food, medicine and medical supplies, supportive services and prayers for the Ukrainian people through our contacts in Poland. Some forms of assistance are also delivered via Polish transport (when possible) to the people in Ukraine. The winter was extremely brutal in Ukraine as so many went without heat, clean water, food, and other everyday essentials. The needs have been great and our fraternal team responded with a spirit of compassion, healing, and hope.

One hundred percent of the donations made to the Royal Arcanum projects for the Ukrainian cause have been put to work, directly helping the people. Our contacts in Poland in the regions of Przemysl, Warsaw, Halinow, Krakow and Lomza, are working 'round the clock to aid their Ukrainian "guests", many of whom are residing in convents until they finalize plans for their next steps, whether returning home when safe to do so, connecting with family in other parts of the globe, making a

temporary home in another country, or something else. The men stayed in Ukraine to serve in the military and many of their families who left for safety wished to

remain in Polish towns so that they could be reunited quickly when possible. During the past few months, the sisters learned of many tragic stories of seriously wounded soldiers enduring frostbite, amputation of limbs, and death. The sisters never tired and tripled their efforts by collecting warm clothing, blankets, and footwear to support the military units, plus medicines and other supplies that were greatly needed.

The sick and elderly in Ukraine were too frail to travel, so families are separated and their days remain filled with fear of the unknown. The youngsters are adjusting to attending school while learning in a foreign language and adapting to new surroundings. Some youngsters are easily frightened at the sound of a siren or loud noise (thinking it's a signal of bombing like they heard in Ukraine).

The road ahead will not be an easy one, although the convents, parishes, universities, and host families continue to open their doors and welcome Ukrainian guests and provide them with a safe haven.

On behalf of the Fraternal Events Committee, a heartfelt "Thank you" is extended to everyone for participating in this charitable effort and for sharing a ray of sunshine across the miles. Our RA programs will continue for the Ukrainian cause, as do the prayers and hope that international peace will soon be a reality for all.

#### SPIRIT OF SERVICE AWARD



The Supreme Council Fraternal Department is pleased to announce that Claremont Council #1655 in New York is the recipient of the Donald E. Ferry, Jr. Spirit of Service Award for 2022.

The award program, in tribute to Brother "Don", was developed to carry forth his legacy of dedicated service to our fraternal benefit society. Its

purpose is to "See a Need and Take the Lead" in support of a children's charity or charitable program for the benefit of children.

The members of Claremont Council have followed in Donald's footsteps with their support of children's causes. Once again, they were fraternalists-in-action for the benefit of Children of Promise, NYC; an organization that operates facilities in the Bronx and Brooklyn communities. Founded in 2009, it is the first and only after-school program and summer day camp specifically designed to meet the needs, interests and concerns of children left behind by a parent serving time in prison. The organization strives to have the children succeed and achieve their human potential. On-site help is available 5 days a week from a team of psychiatrists, social workers, creative arts therapists and volunteers. One-to-one mentoring is also part of the programs for the youth.

The Arcanians supported the children and teens at Children of Promise with an assortment of wonderful gifts. They were instrumental in securing prom gowns,

dresses, and suits, plus shoes and accessories for the high schoolers. These gifts would enable the students to feel special and proud to attend their junior and senior formal events being hosted in the spring.

The fraternalists delivered over 200 boxes of cereal for the children so that they would have nutritious snacks to enjoy at home. Many of the youth may only have one substantial meal per day and the any-time-of-day

food staple would help them fight being hungry.

School supplies, healthcare items, and a variety of toys also added to the gifting project. The Grand Council of New York joined the members of Claremont by making a \$500 donation through the Royal Arcanum's International Fraternal Service Fund to Children of Promise, NYC.

### **BAKER'S BOX: ST. JOSEPH'S ZEPPOLE**

Enjoy this recipe shared by Past Supreme Regent Errica Conforto. Zeppole shells are made of classic choux pastry dough; the puffs are filled with pastry cream. They can be deep-fried or made in the oven.

#### FOR THE DOUGH:

I cub water I 1/2 sticks butter 2 cubs flour 1/2 teaspoon salt 6-7 eggs sour cherry or marmalade confectioners sugar for dusting



#### FOR THE PASTRY CREAM:

I quart milk I cup sugar 4 eggs 1/2 cup flour lemon peel I tbsp. vanilla extract



#### **SUPPLIES:**

Heavy pastry bag with large star tip Baking sheet lined with parchment paper



Preheat oven to 390 degrees. Baking time is 30-35 minutes, plus an additional 7-10 minutes with the oven door a few inches open. (I put a wooden spoon in between the door and the stove).

Cream can be made the day before.



DOUGH: In a medium pot, combine water, butter, and salt. Heat on stove-

top and bring to boil. Reduce heat to low and add all the flour at once. Mix well with a wooden spoon until the dough comes together in a smooth ball. Transfer into a mixer bowl. Using the dough hook, beat for a few minutes for the dough to cool down a bit. (The dough should be warm, not hot when the eggs are added in the next step). Add eggs, one at a time. Add the next egg AFTER the previous one has been completely incorporated. At the end, the dough should reach the consistency of a thick cream, smooth and glossy, and when hanging from the spoon, should form a kind of V-shape on the spoon. Transfer the dough to a pastry bag with a large starshaped tip and start piping the zeppole onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper.

Leave enough space between the pastries, as they'll double in size. Bake (as indicated above). Let them cool off before filling with cream.

CREAM: In a bowl, beat eggs with sugar; add flour and a bit less than ½ cup of milk. While mixing, heat (but don't boil) the remaining milk with the lemon peel on the stove-top. Reduce heat to low and slowly start pouring in the egg batter; whisk and turn to prevent lumps and cream from sticking to the bottom of the pot. Continue whisking until the cream starts to thicken and bubble for few minutes. Remove from heat ASAP and transfer to a large bowl. Remove the lemon peel, add I tablespoon of vanilla

Fill pastry bag with cream, pipe cream in the middle of the zeppole and add another swirl of cream on the top. Dust with confectioners sugar; top with a cherry or marmalade.

extract and mix. Cover with plastic

wrap and refrigerate to cool.



## IN MEMORIAM: WILLIAM J. WIRE



The Supreme Council is sad to announce that Brother William lames "Bill" Wire passed from this life on January 26, 2023. Bill was born and raised in the Little Italy neighborhood of Chicago, Illinois. He was a veteran of the United States Army, having served as a Paratrooper in the 101st Airborne Division. He later

returned to Chicago to enter the workforce. His commitment to a strong work ethic was always demonstrated; he retired as Administrator of SEIU Local #4 Health and Welfare Fund. He was also an active

officer and member of several community organizations in the Chicago area and enjoyed spending time with family and friends, whether at a council event, a Cubs baseball game, a stop at a casino, or for dinner at a quiet restaurant or even a lively diner.

## **CHIEF OPERATIONS OFFICER CORNER**

As spring is in full swing, it's time to recognize that the Royal Arcanum celebrates its 146th anniversary this year. It's interesting to note how things have evolved in the fraternal world in so many ways.

One main premise is that Royal Arcanum and fraternal societies exist for the benefit of members. In 1877, life insurance was only available to those who were well off financially. A main reason why fraternal societies developed was to provide insurance protection against the unexpected to a broader range of families. Frequently, when a breadwinner passed away, the family

tragically suffered without having any financial protection. Royal Arcanum continues to provide competitively priced insurance products to members, as well as a 5-year

deferred annuity, currently paying a 4% growth rate. As a Society, we do this while continuing to provide many benefits to members and to our communities.

In 2022 we increased membership, while increasing our first year and renewal life insurance premium in the 30 states we are licensed. This trend has continued through the first quarter of

2023 and we expect to increase membership and premium revenue again in 2023. Our sales department has increased our independent agent sales force dramatically, along with implementing enhanced technology for a more efficient application process for the member/potential member and agent. We have finalized our scholarship applications for the 2023/2024 school year; these are being reviewed by an independent scholarship judge. The scholarship winners, including a \$10,000 scholarship, will be featured in our next Bulletin.

A new fraternal investment bill was filed within the Massachusetts legislation in January. H1100 requests an amendment restricting fraternal benefit societies to invest up to 25% of surplus in equities to 10% of assets. This would provide the ability to increase investment revenue along with the ability to adjust our current rate of return, which we monitor closely, based on the everchanging market.

As we're in the midst of the nicer spring weather, more opportunities will entice us to get out and support our communities. We have a wonderful International Fraternal Service program to support Subordinate and

## **COMPUTER SECURITY AT HOME**

Internet safety at home is crucial to protect yourself and your family from online threats such as identity theft, cyberbullying, phishing scams, malware, and other cyber attacks.

They also expect that the increased use of Al, or advanced intelligence services will help these criminals do a better job at deep faking people into giving up bank account or other financial information.

However, there are steps you can take to protect yourselves and your families. A few popular tips to enhance your home internet safety are:

- I) Keep your software up to date: Make sure that your operating system, antivirus, and other software are updated regularly to protect your device from vulnerabilities that hackers may exploit.
- 2) Use strong passwords: Create unique and strong passwords for all your online accounts, including your Wi-Fi network. Avoid using personal information or easily guessable passwords.

- **3) Enable two-factor authentication:** Two-factor authentication adds an extra layer of security to your online accounts. It requires you to provide an additional verification code or fingerprint to log in.


