



TIPS FOR WHEN YOU BUY A SECOND HOME

Thinking of buying a second home? You don't have to be rich, but you do have to be careful. The New York Times offers these tips on keeping costs a little more reasonable:

- **Lock in your mortgage rate early.** Mortgage rates are on the upswing. You'll save money in a volatile economy by getting your mortgage approved as early as possible, before the rate goes up even more. Compare rates so you can find the best one for you.
- **Negotiate your closing costs.** You can sometimes bargain for a lower cost on some closing fees, like pest inspections. Some costs are non-negotiable, but take a close look at everything in your agreement for items you can reduce.



- **Examine maintenance fees.** If you're buying a condo or any community with a homeowners association, remember that you'll have fees on top of the selling price. INCREASE YOUR PRODUCTIVITY WITHOUT BURNING OUT

Being more productive isn't just doing things faster. It takes a shift in your mindset. Follow this advice from the Everygirl website for getting more done—better:

- **Start a “Happy” file.** Collect emails from bosses and customers praising your work, and keep them in a separate file on your desk or computer. Take a look at them when you're about to start a new project, or at the beginning of the week. This will build your confidence and motivation.
- **Track progress, not to-do lists.** A to-do list is a good start to any project, but it's also useful to keep track of your progress toward completion. Map out how long your goal will take to reach, and the steps necessary to get there. Use your map to prioritize activities and manage your energy over the long haul.
- **Use the buddy system.** Connect with a colleague who will help you stay on schedule as you



work. They shouldn't nag you about deadlines, but they can offer support and encouragement when your motivation starts to fade. Check in with your buddy on a daily or weekly basis. This gives you a level of accountability that can keep you moving forward.

- **Find the right task management tools.** A weekly planner is perhaps the bare minimum. Look around and invest in digital tools that will help you stay on task more actively, offering daily or hourly reminders of deadlines, commitments, and other priorities.
- **Be realistic.** Don't strive for perfection at the expense of productivity. Focus on what's important and leave nonessential tasks behind. Turn down requests that don't fit your schedule or goals. Eliminate tasks that don't contribute to your eventual success.

Helping Hands for Ukraine: Update

The Supreme Council is thankful to all of the councils, members, and friends for their generous response to the Fraternal Department's request to support our Society's national project for the Ukrainian people as an unjust and unprovoked war was afflicted on their homeland in late February. As of June 30, 2022, over \$22,000 was contributed to the Royal Arcanum project for the Ukrainian people – those who fled to Poland and to neighboring countries, and those who have remained in Ukraine during this turbulent and tragic time.

As an extended family, the Royal Arcanum has offered funds, all-new clothing and other goods, food, medicine and medical supplies, supportive services and prayers for the Ukrainian people through our contacts in Poland. Some forms of assistance are also delivered via Polish transport (when safe to do so) to people who remain in Ukraine. Many are in extreme need of everyday essentials. They shelter in fear with an uncertainty of being spared and the unknown if the horrors of war will end in their country.

One hundred percent of the donations made to the Royal Arcanum project for the Ukrainian cause are directly helping the people. The funds and goods are sent via air and ocean and are gratefully acknowledged by our contacts in Poland who are located in Przemysl, Warsaw, Halinow, Krakow and Lomza, and immediately "put to work" for Ukraine.

A request from the Ukrainian people for rosaries was

thoughtfully answered by Grand Regent Joanie Francis and the California Arcanians with their donation of 400 prayer bead-units. Roy Al, our "Fraternal Ambassador," assisted the Grand Council of Rhode Island in securing donations, too. Many jurisdictions have encouraged participation in the project; a testament of the benevolent spirit that is shared throughout our councils.

The efforts will continue in the months ahead. The next step of our project will be a Baby-Toddler Friendship Shower that will be held at the Supreme Council Session in Annapolis. Numerous expectant mothers are choosing to stay in Polish-Ukrainian border towns in the hope that they will be reunited with their loved ones in the near future. For now, many of the convents and universities, as well as family homes and parishes, are opening their doors as they welcome the Ukrainian guests and provide them with comfort and a safe haven.

TELL THE WORLD ALL ABOUT YOU

An “About Me” document can help you promote yourself as a professional brand, establishing your position in your field. Writing about yourself without either bragging or downplaying your accomplishments can feel tricky, though. The Ladders website explains how to pull it off:

- **Outline your career.**

Explain where you are now and how you got there—education, positions with all your employers, and so forth. Tell people how your background makes you unique.

- **Share your passions.**

Highlight what you’re most passionate about in your work—helping people, advancing knowledge, improving your company, etc.

What do you enjoy most about your current job?

- **Emphasize your accomplishments.** What are some of your most significant personal and professional achievements? Describe how you accomplished them, and




what the results meant. Explain how your particular skills and competencies contributed to your success.

- **Where do you want to go next?** Even if you’re not actively looking for another job, you can share your professional ambitions. Maybe you want more responsibility or make a greater contribution to your industry, or master new skills that will help you accomplish more.

When writing your “About Me” document, use language you’re comfortable with—don’t try to impress people with jargon or vocabulary words you don’t really know. Be concise; provide enough information to get people interested, but not so much they’ll get bored. Proofread

and edit your page so it looks and sounds professional. Above all, tell the truth. Exaggerating your achievements or claiming experience you don’t really have will backfire on you eventually.

TREASURE FROM OUR PAST

145-year fraternal history. Pictured is a delegate’s badge from the 65th Supreme Council Session held in 1940.

The piece features the letters of the Order’s fraternal objectives in

corresponding colors. The colored letters are intertwined and symbolize: V – Virtue (white), M- Mercy (light blue), and C – Charity (deep purple). The letter ‘C’ underlies both the ‘V’ and ‘M’ since Charity is the foundation of the Society and is the royal attribute.

This summer, the Royal Arcanum will host the 105th Supreme Council Session; the legacy of fraternal service begun by our founders in 1877 continues on all council levels and is evident in the many charitable works that are conducted in our jurisdictions.



BAKER'S BOX: MUFFINS WITH CHERRY PRESERVES

Past Supreme Regent Errica Conforto shares this special recipe for moist, tasty muffins that are filled with cherry preserves. These treats make a delicious choice for breakfast, snack or dessert and are sure to become a family favorite!

INGREDIENTS:

2 large eggs
zest of 1 lemon
½ cup sugar
¼ cup vegetable oil
½ cup water
1 ¾ cups flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
fruit preserves

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

In a large bowl, add the 2 eggs, lemon zest, sugar, oil, and water and using a hand mixer, mix until combined. Gradually add flour (little at a time) and baking powder. Mix well until smooth.

Spoon the batter evenly into prepared non-stick muffin pans or muffin paper cups. Add one teaspoon cherry preserves (or other flavor) or Nutella.

Place filled pans into the oven and bake for 25-30 minutes. Remove and cool. Sprinkle with confectioners sugar and enjoy!

"Really? How did I do that?"


During our fun Birthday Party, we collectively decided to donate \$200.00 to the “Ukraine Baby Shower”, which will happen at our Supreme Council Session!

CHIEF OPERATIONS OFFICER CORNER

I congratulate all of our scholarship and grant winners this year. The scholarship judge (who is independent of Royal Arcanum) had many quality applications to evaluate when determining the award winners.

I thank Junior Director Errica Conforto for the opportunity to contact the recipients to advise them that they won a Royal Arcanum award. I'm proud that our Society provides this support to our members, with scholarship awards up to \$10,000. As a reminder: December 31st is the deadline for applications for the upcoming school year. If you will be attending college or a trade school next fall (2023), make sure your application is submitted on time.

We have continued to see consistent life insurance production, with an increase in first year and renewal premium. As of June 30th, (Q2), there have been increases of over 5% in first year and renewal life premiums. The life insurance industry in general has had application volume down as of Q2 by as much as 5%, compared to 2021. The increase in production for the Royal Arcanum is a nice accomplishment, with credit due to our Home Office associates for providing great service, our volunteer recommenders for new enrollments, and the agents for marketing our products.

The summer season is a great time to reconnect with friends and family. I look forward to seeing many members at the Supreme Council Session in August.

Make that extra call to someone you may not see often. Far too often we lose contact and only see those we care about at a wedding or funeral. A call or text can make someone's day! I, for one, can get easily caught up with schedules; whether it is in the office or for the kids' weekend activities. However, I schedule a "to do" list to dedicate time for checking-in on friends and family members who don't live close by. Last year, I lost a close mentor of mine who was like a second dad to me. He always stressed the importance of staying in contact with friends and family because sometimes a call or text can turn someone's day around.

It's also important to protect our families and one way is with life insurance to protect them against the unexpected. The Home Office is available to discuss your insurance needs from Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. EST.

It's great to see our Fraternal Department, led by Cindy Macon, continue to drive our Ukrainian project and receive donations. If you haven't donated personally or through your council,

please consider donating to such a worthy cause, as all project funds go directly to the Ukrainian people.

DON'T BLINDLY FOLLOW THIS FINANCIAL ADVICE

Teaching your children about money is a task that will reward them for the rest of their life. Just be sure the advice you give is good. The Insider website cautions against these misconceptions about managing finances, especially when you're young:

- **Focus exclusively on saving.** Saving is good, but don't just lock your money in a checking account. Learn the fundamentals of investing to make your money grow. You don't have to gamble in the stock market; look for funds that limit your risk, and invest for the long term.
- **Don't quit your job without six months' savings.** Changing jobs is risky, but sometimes staying in a high-stress, low paying job can be worse. Do your homework so you know what's available, and don't talk yourself out of taking a leap for a better opportunity.



- **Eliminate all luxuries.** Yes, you should be careful about impulse buying or spending money on things you don't really need, but don't feel guilty about the occasional splurge. Instead of cutting back, look for ways to earn more money.

- **Student loans are always bad.** The college loan crisis can make you think that all student loans should be avoided, but that doesn't mean college is a waste of money. You learn more than just how to make a living at college—you learn skills and behaviors that can guide the rest of your life. Choose your course of study wisely, look for alternatives to loans, and borrow in moderate amounts so you don't get buried under debt when you graduate.

- **Keep money matters private.** If you don't talk about money, you'll have no idea if you're reaching your potential. Do some research to find out what the market is like in your profession, and talk to colleagues to get a better idea of where you're at and what's possible to achieve.

JUNIOR DEPARTMENT NEWS AND VIEWS


