### **HELP FOR UKRAINE CONTINUES**

The Supreme Council is very appreciative of the ongoing efforts of our fraternal family in generously supporting our Society's projects for the Ukrainian people as their homeland remains impacted by war. During the past year and a half, the Royal Arcanum has provided close to \$50,000 for the cause. All funds and gifts directly help the Ukrainian people – those who fled to Poland and neighboring countries and those who remained in Ukraine to face uncertainty, every day.

Through the generosity of our members across the Supreme Council jurisdiction, the Royal Arcanum's Fraternal Department continues to send funds, all-new clothing, bedding and other goods, food, medicine and medical supplies, supportive services and prayers for the Ukrainian people to our secure contacts in Poland. Some forms of assistance are also delivered via Polish transport (when possible) to the convents in Ukraine for the Sisters to aid the residents there. The challenges and crises are great, yet our fraternalists never falter to provide compassion, healing, and hope. The war has been especially difficult for the small children and the elderly.

One hundred percent of the donations made to the Royal Arcanum projects for the Ukrainian cause are

making a difference and providing essentials at a time when basic items are sparse. Our contacts in Poland in the regions of Przemysl, Warsaw, Halinow,

Krakow and Lomza remain dedicated to helping their

Ukrainian "guests", many of whom left their country with only a tote or small bag of their belongings. They are now residing in convents, dormitories, and private family

homes while they learn a new language and seek employment. The children need to adjust as well to school in a new country and instruction in a new language. Undoubtedly it's a long road ahead. The Royal Arcanum has received many acknowledgments from the Sisters and the Ukrainian people for the warmth, kindness, and generosity shown to them since the war began; they are extremely grateful to have been remembered by such "wonderful friends across the ocean."

The Fraternal Events Committee will continue efforts *Into the Future* and with prayers and a fervent hope that peace will abide for all people, all over the world.

They recently learned that Bob was in need of brown paper bags and egg cartons. The bags are used to transport donated goods to area churches of all denominations for their programs to help those in need. The egg cartons go to St. James School in North Philadelphia where students raise hens and learn to care for the birds. The eggs that they do not use are given for the church's Saturday Welcome Table (much like a farmer's market), which offers fresh food and other necessities to anyone in need.

St. Francis Inn, located in the Kensington section of Philadelphia, is committed to helping the homeless and provides meals and food for more than 100 people every day. The Tedescos were introduced to the Inn by Joan's godmother Helen who volunteered at its adjacent shop for nearly 50 years. There, she and other volunteers sorted and prepared goods for distribution to those in need. The Tedescos have supported the Inn ever since and are grateful to see that its mission has continued for all these years.

### **NEW JERSEY'S MEMORIAL OBSERVANCES**


Members of the New Jersey Grand Council continued their tradition of conducting activities in observance of Memorial Day.

### **FAMILY SAFETY, BE PREPARED!!**

First aid is the immediate assistance given to someone who is injured or suddenly

becomes ill. It aims to stabilize the person's condition and prevent further harm until professional medical help arrives. Here are some basic first aid tips and supplies:

I) Assess the situation: Ensure your safety and evaluate the scene for any potential hazards before approaching the injured person.



clean cloth or sterile dressing. Elevate the injured limb if possible.

Maintain pressure until the bleeding stops or professional help arrives.

- 6) CPR
  (Cardiopulmonary resuscitation): If someone is unconscious and not breathing normally, perform CPR if you are trained in it. The steps generally include chest compressions
- and rescue breaths.

- 2) Call for help: Dial the emergency services in your country (e.g., 911 in the United States) or ask someone nearby to do so. Provide clear information about the situation and the person's condition.
- 3) Stay calm and reassure the injured person: Your presence and reassurance can help them feel more at ease.
- **4) Basic supplies:** It's essential to have a basic first aid kit readily available. Some common items include:
  - \* Adhesive bandages (various sizes)
  - \* Sterile gauze pads
  - \* Adhesive tape
  - \* Antiseptic wipes or solution
  - \* Disposable gloves
  - \* Scissors
  - \* Tweezers
  - \* Instant cold packs
  - \* CPR face mask or shield
  - \* Disposable resuscitation barrier (for rescue breaths)
  - \* Emergency blanket
- **5) Bleeding and wound care:** If someone is bleeding, apply direct pressure on the wound with a

- 7) Choking: If someone is choking and unable to breathe, perform the Heimlich maneuver or abdominal thrusts to help clear the airway. Learn this technique from a certified first aid training course.
- **8) Burns:** For minor burns, run cool water over the affected area for at least 10 minutes. Do not use ice or adhesive bandages on the burn. For severe burns, call emergency services immediately.
- **9) Poisoning:** If someone has ingested a potentially harmful substance, contact poison control or emergency services right away. Provide them with accurate details about the substance ingested, if known.

Remember, these are just basic first aid tips. It is highly recommended to attend a certified first aid and CPR course to learn the proper techniques and procedures for various situations.

### IN MEMORIAM: PAUL F. D'EMILIO, ESQ.

The Supreme Council is sad to announce that Brother Paul F. D'Emilio, Esq. passed from this life on June 19, 2023. Paul was a talented individual, dedicated to his faith, family, friends, and fraternity. He graduated Villanova University in 1968 and its School of Law in 1972. He served his country in the United States Army Reserve.

A respected attorney and member of the community, Paul practiced law in Pennsylvania for most of his adult life. He served on the Parish Council of St. Dorothy's Church, Havertown. He had been 9th Ward Commissioner and Vice-Chair of the Planning Commission for Haverford Township, Delaware County, PA. He served as President of the Optimist Club of Havertown and was a Distinguished Lieutenant Governor of Optimist International. Paul served on the Board of Directors and Law Committee of the NFCA (AFA) and was a member of the Association of Fraternal Benefit Counsel. He was a member of the Sons of Italy, a 4th degree member of the Knights of Columbus, and built houses as a volunteer with Habitat for Humanity. Service was ingrained to his core!

Brother D'Emilio enrolled into Royal Arcanum's Integrity Council #586, Philadelphia in 1974. From

1990 until his passing, he served as Chairman/Member of the Supreme Council Committee on Laws and in 2016 was awarded Life Membership in the Supreme Council. Paul's commitment to the attributes of the Society was constant. He enrolled many family members and friends and achieved the Founders' Ring of Distinction with Diamond, the highest award that the Society bestows. For the past 27 years Brother D'Emilio served as Legal Counsel for the Royal Arcanum; his wisdom, experience and approachability were greatly appreciated, especially by members of the Executive Committee and Home Office Associates, with whom he closely worked. He was extremely knowledgeable in the business and fraternal operations of the Society and could name/quote the sections of the 170-page Constitution and Laws in an instant! He was gifted with a brilliant mind and as bright a personality!

Paul and his beloved wife, Lorraine, married in 1974. Their union was blessed with three children; they were a 100% Royal Arcanum family. Their generosity of heart was always expressed through the Society's charitable

programs and for a multitude of causes sponsored on all council levels. Each year, Paul, as a 'Secret Santa' contributed a holiday gift in honor of the Royal Arcanum to a charity designated by the Fraternal Department.

Following Lorraine's death in 2010, as a way to honor her memory and to help women afflicted with GYN cancers. Paul formed the





### **COOK'S NOOK: ARTICHOKE QUICHE**

We hope that our readers enjoy preparing this tasty recipe shared by Past Supreme Regent Errica Conforto. The guiche will soon become a favorite of family and friends!

I (9-inch) pie crust

I (12 oz.) pkg. frozen artichokes

salt and pepper [to taste]

2-3 garlic cloves, chopped

3 Tbs. olive oil

1/2 glass water

3 whole eggs plus I yolk for topping

I cup shredded mozzarella cheese

3-4 Tbs. grated parmesan cheese (or 1/2 parmesan & 1/2 romano cheese)

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

In a frying pan, saute frozen artichokes with olive oil, chopped garlic, and 1/2 glass of water for about 12-15 minutes (until tender). Add salt and pepper to taste. Remove pan from heat.

In a bowl, beat the 3 whole eggs. Add grated parmesan cheese, mozzarella, and artichokes. Combine the ingredients well and add salt and pepper to taste. Prick the pie crust with a fork and pour in the artichoke mixture. Then add the beaten egg yolk on top of the mixture.

Bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or until lightly browned.









### A WORD FROM THE SUPREME SECRETARY

SUMMER IS HERE!!!

Greetings Brothers and Sisters,

As the weather warms up and family fun time begins, we must remember to be safe.

Our family recently volunteered with the New England Hemophilia Association in New Hampshire at Lake Winnipesaukee. It was a fun time for all who attended, but there was one thing on everyone's mind, and that was safety. The event welcomed toddlers

though seniors and we had to ensure the safety of all.

Here are some helpful tips for your next outdoor adventure:

Water safety: Have life jackets for everyone on a boat and if you're on the shore, have floaties available.

**Sunscreen:** Use it to avoid sunburn and the risk of skin cancer. If you apply sunscreen (including the waterproof types) and then go in the water, make sure you reapply when you get out.

### Walking in the woods:

The activity can be both enjoyable and educational. Follow trails that are well-marked because if anyone in the group gets hurt, the

emergency response time will be less. Wear proper footwear for support and comfort and bring along extra socks! When I was in the military, we went on many road marches and my extra socks and foot powder were a blessing for keeping my feet dry and blister free. Beware of unfamiliar plants (poison ivy, poison oak), insects and ticks! While sprays help keep the pests at bay, you should also check yourself. If you have a concern about the ingredients of some sprays, go on-line to find homemade sprays that work just as well.

**Hydration:** Water is key and staying hydrated helps to prevent heat cramps, heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Although beverages may be plentiful at a BBQ, a refreshing drink of H<sub>2</sub>O will help maintain your water levels.



**Shade:** Take along an umbrella to provide some cover and relief. It will also offer some protection if a downpour occurs unexpectedly!

Charged cell phones: Many of us have experienced the dilemma of having a phone about to die and nowhere to charge it. As a preventive measure, we purchased some extra battery packs and charging cord and keep them in the car's glovebox for road trips. If power goes out (even in the winter), we can stay charged, too!

**First Aid Kits:** All of the useful items contained in the kit should be checked occasionally and those with expired dates replaced.

**Food:** Pack healthy, protein-rich snacks for your ventures.

Extra clothing: Be prepared for weather changes and the unexpected! A blanket for cool nights may also come in handy.

Maps: Although cell phones have GPS capabilities, a map will be useful if your cell phone dies or if you're in the mountains or remote area where GPS won't work.

These are some of the

things that our family remembers to pack as we venture out for some fun in the sun. Hope you find the suggestions helpful. Even if you remain at home over the summer, have safety in mind and enjoy the time with your guests!


