INTERNATIONAL FRATERNAL SERVICE

Members of Claremont Council #1655 in New York sponsored their International Fraternal Service projects in collaboration with the Supreme Council by making monetary donations of \$500 each to three charitable organizations in the Bronx community. The gifts were presented by Maria and Freddy DiBartolo, Errica and Joe Conforto, Augie Magnotta, and Teresa Di Bartolo.

Calvary Hospital was the recipient of the first donation. The acute care specialty hospital provides palliative care for adult patients with advanced cancer and other life-threatening illnesses.

The second donation was made to the Sisters of Life. Founded in 1991 by John Cardinal O'Connor, the Sisters, in vowing to protect and enhance the sacredness of every human life, serve women who are pregnant. They offer retreats, hope and healing as part of their mission. Their extraordinary work saves babies at risk of abortion.

The third donation was delivered to the Sisters, Servants of Mary, Ministers to the Sick; a religious community and nursing

order that is devoted to tendering compassionate, home health nursing for the sick and dying, day or night, free of charge.

The members presented the Grand Council of New York's \$500 IFS donation to Children of Promise, NYC to further its work of supporting and advocating for the children of incarcerated parents. Staff and volunteers create opportunities for the youngsters to thrive and achieve their full potential through programs that include mental health services, academic enrichment, and one-to-one mentoring. In addition to the monetary contribution, clothes, coats, toys, and 80 boxes of cereal were provided by the fraternalists for the children.

The recipient organizations acknowledged the Royal Arcanum for having been selected as beneficiaries of the 2022 International Fraternal Service Fund. It is gratifying to witness that the Society's founding objective of 'Charity' continues to guide fraternal work in New York and throughout the Supreme Council.



Medora members collected a truckload of needed items and delivered them to Leyden Fam



DON'T SLIP IN THE BATHROOM

Are you safe in your bathroom? Consumer Reports has some tips for ensuring you don't injure yourself in or out of the tub:

- **Get rubber-backed rugs.** Your bathroom rugs should have rubber on the bottom to prevent slips and falls.
- Check your shower doors. Small nicks and scratches can create stress points which may break and cause cuts and injuries. Replace glass doors if they're damaged, and be sure they're aligned properly.
- Make your shower safe. Keep the temperature on your water heater at 120 degrees to prevent scalding. Add grab bars to keep yourself steady.

The first game at the "old" Yankee Stadium, home of the New York Yankees was played one hundred years ago in 1923! The game ended with the Yankees victory over the Boston Red Sox, by a score of 4-1. Babe Ruth hit a three-run homer into the right-field stands to secure the win.

At the time, Yankee Stadium had the largest number of seats of any ballpark in America. It was hailed as a one-of-a-kind facility and was often referred to as "The House That Ruth Built" and "The Cathedral of Baseball." Over time, the stadium became a famous venue, hosting

World Series games, boxing matches, concerts and three papal masses.

The stadium became a symbol of American culture and its legacy carries on through the team's current stadium that opened in 2009. You could say that fans in the stadium add to the excitement of each game and become a great part of that legacy, too! All across the country they exhibit pride for

their favorite baseball team by wearing jerseys and caps, cheering as players run the bases, and purchasing yearbooks, pennants and nifty souvenirs to take back home.

THREE SMART USES FOR RUBBING ALCOHOL


Rubbing alcohol has many uses for health and well-being. Check out these from the Healthgrades website:

- Wounds and bites. Use rubbing alcohol or alcohol pads for minor wounds that puncture the skin. Be careful, though; alcohol can slow skin healing, kill new cell growth, and dry out your skin. (It may also sting!)
- **Tick bites.** After removing the tick from your skin with tweezers, clean the site of the bite with

rubbing alcohol (or soap and water). Place the tick in alcohol or flush it down the toilet. Call your doctor if a rash or fever develops.

• **Swimmer's ear.** If your ear canal becomes inflamed, mix a solution of one part alcohol and one part vinegar. Apply a few drops to your ear. Again, call your doctor if the condition doesn't improve.

The members of Claremont Council #1655 In New York sadly report the passing of Brother Carmine Campo on September 13, 2022.

boxed cake mix by using a gas oven. Grace became a skilled cook and baker; her dishes and desserts were favorites of family and friends.

Grace married H. Joseph Hepford in 1952 and together they raised two daughters. She enrolled into Royal Arcanum's Harrisburg Council #499 in 1964 and from the start, she and Joe became immersed in service to our Society. Following the election of Brother Hepford as Supreme Regent in 1990, Grace, as the Royal Arcanum's

First Lady, accompanied him on ventures throughout the United States and Canada to lead the innovative "Be a Performer" and "Go for the Gold" campaigns.

Sister Grace organized the golf tournaments at many Supreme Council Sessions and was instrumental in developing fraternal and charitable service projects that were conducted on behalf of the Society. Joe and Grace had traveled extensively across the globe. They were frequent guest speakers at councils throughout the Northeast to share their experiences and adventures of many countries, including a thrilling African safari.

BAKER'S BOX: SUSUMELLI

Enjoy this recipe shared by Past Supreme Regent Errica Conforto. The Calabrian biscuits are flavored with cocoa, cinnamon and clove spices and coated with melted chocolate. It is an easy recipe and no eggs are needed for these tasty treats.

INGREDIENTS

4 cups sifted flour

I cup sifted cocoa powder (Hershey's 100% cocoa)

I cup sugar

3/4 cup vegetable oil

I cup milk

I ½ teaspoons baking powder (mix with the flour)

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

I 1/2 teaspoons ground clove spice

I cup chocolate chips (semi-sweet morsels)

2 baking sheets lined with parchment paper

Preheat oven to 360 degrees.





In a large mixing bowl (with a wooden spoon) or Kitchen Aid (with a flat beater), combine flour with baking powder, sugar and cocoa. Mix together. Add oil, milk, cinnamon and clove. Stir and mix until well-combined into a soft oily dough.

With your hands, roll dough into balls (each as big as a walnut) and shape into oval forms. Place each onto a lined baking sheet.

Bake for 12-15 minutes. Remove from oven and allow to cool completely.

As a final step, melt chocolate chips in a microwave at intervals of 30 seconds until completely melted. Dip (or brush) the top of each biscuit in the melted chocolate.

Cool completely and then enjoy with family and friends.







CHIEF OPERATIONS OFFICER CORNER

2022 brought many of our members back together at the Supreme Council Session in Annapolis, MD, held for the first time since 2018. It was certainly great to see many of our members and I look forward to a full capacity Session in 2024. In 2022 we encountered many challenges, yet we endured and continued to progress as a Society as we grew our membership. This is an accomplishment that we should be proud of in a challenging environment. New members were added in 29 of the 30 states in which the Royal Arcanum is licensed, as well as in DC.

Our life insurance operation saw first year premiums increase by 8.9% and renewal premiums increase by 8.5%. These impressive results can be attributed to



the positive impact of distribution firms who have been added to market our insurance products. Sales Director Bill Paulo has been diligent about adding agents who understand our products and the impact Royal Arcanum has across the communities where we are licensed.

In 2022, one of the challenges we faced was the realization that we needed to complete a reinsurance assumption agreement to have another insurer administer our Canadian insurance business, due to continued increases in expenses when compared to limited production. Therefore, the Executive Committee, General Counsel, and Senior

Management worked diligently to find a partner who would align with our fraternal mission and be able to administer our Canadian members' insurance policies. We found this partner in Teachers Life, a fellow fraternal society. Members were also able

to continue to be Royal



Arcanum members since another class of members was added to our Constitution with the approval that was granted at the Session. As a result of the transaction, there will be a one-time charge against our surplus in 2022. However, there will be a significant operational savings annually, starting in 2023.

With the ever-rising interest rates, we were pleased to announce an increase to the current annuity credited rate to 4% as of October 1st, 2022. It's important that we offer competitive insurance products while being prudent as an operation.

STATE FRATERNAL ALLIANCE HONORS






